

NAVY FENCERS WIN TITLE BY 2 POINTS

Columbia, New York U., City
College and Rutgers Share
2d in N. C. A. A. Meet

DETROIT, March 25 (AP)—Navy today won the sixth National Collegiate A. A. fencing tournament by two points.

The Middies piled up 67½ points in the two-day meet to top Rutgers, defending co-champion, and three other schools tied for second. Sharing the runner-up spot with Rutgers were New York University, City College of New York and Columbia.

All the top ten finishers were from the East, except Notre Dame, in sixth place with 61½ points. Princeton and Penn had 60 each and Yale and Cornell had 58½.

Navy's Tom Stuart sparked his three-man team to victory over the field of thirty-three colleges, collecting 24½ points to win the épée title.

Robert Neilson of Columbia won in foil with 31 points. The defending saber champion, Alex Treves of Rutgers, scored 27 to beat Dick Watson of Wayne University, the host school, by a single mark.

Army, which shared the team title with Rutgers a year ago, was sixteenth with 43½ points.
