

# Columbia Gains Team Laurels In National Collegiate Fencing

EAST LANSING, Mich., March 26—Columbia University, the Intercollegiate Association saber titleholder, won the team crown in the finals of the National Collegiate Athletic Association's fencing championships today at Michigan State College.

Columbia scored 62 points. Cornell was in second place with 57 and Navy was third with 55.

The top three spots in the finals were identical with the placements after yesterday's first card of round-robin bouts.

Barry Pariser of Columbia was the individual champion in the saber. He took twenty and lost two engagements. Nyles Ayres of Columbia placed second in the

épée. Ralph DeMarco was fourth for the Lions in the foil.

In the saber, Pariser and Walter Farber of Pennsylvania had 20-2 records after the end of the regulation meet. They engaged in one more match to decide the championship. The Columbia entry won, 5—2.

The individual champion in the épée was Donald Tadrawski of Notre Dame, with a 22-and-a-half record. Herman Velasco of Illinois won twenty-two and lost three to top the field in the foil.

John C. Gonzalez of Navy, third in the foil, was named by the competing fencers to receive the Illinois Award as the best sportsman of the meet. It was
