N.C.A.A. CROWNS GO TO 3 SCHOOLS

N.Y.U. Takes Fencing Title --- U.S.C., Okla. State Win

New York University, the University of Southern California and Oklahoma State cap-tured National Collegiate Athletic Association titles Saturday. At Durham, N.C., N.Y.U., sec-

ond last year, won its sixth fencing championship by taking all five of its bouts in the finals. Army was second and Wayne State third.

Columbia won last year. But the Lions and other Ivy League schools did not enter this year because of a dispute with the N.C.A.A. over scholastic grade requirements. The N.Y.U team included two

of Friday's three individual winners, Al Davis in the foil and Paul Apostol in the saber. At the Air Force Academy in

Colorado, U.S.C. took its fourth

straight swimming and diving title, edging Indiana, 302 to 286. Roy Saari, a U.S.C. Olympian, again won three events by taking the 1,650-yard free-style

in 17 minutes 7.17 seconds. He is the first swimmer since Jack Medica of Washington in 1934, 1935 and 1936 to win nine college titles in his varsity career. Oklahoma State, gaining three individual titles at Ames, Iowa, captured its 25th wres-

tling championship. Oklahoma State finished with 79 points to 70 for Iowa State, the defending champion, and 69 for Oklohamo. Yogiro Uetake of Oklahoma State, taking the 131-pound title with a pin, was named the outstanding wrestler for the

second consecutive year.

At the New York Athletic Club, the host team captured four individual titles in taking its eighth straight Amateur Athletic Union Eastern wrestling championship. Bill Farrell of the N.Y.A.C. captured his seventh Eastern title with a victory in the 213.5-pound class. Chicharo Murano of the N.Y.A.C., the 138.5-pound winner was named the tournament' outstanding wrestler. In other tournaments, City College captured the college

rifle sectional championships at Kings Point, L.I.; Los Angeles won its second straight national Golden Gloves boxing tourna-ment at Kansas City, and Nashville took its fifth straight national women's A.A.U. basketball crown at Gallup, N.M.
