

N.C.A.A. FENCING IS WON BY N.Y.U.

10th Crown for Violets— Westbrook, Hurme Excel

BALTIMORE, March 17—New York University celebrated its 50th year of fencing today by capturing its 10th National Collegiate championship, a record.

The Violets, who have been coached by Hugo Castello for 26 years, accumulated 76 points, 5 more than second place Pennsylvania. Wayne State was third with 64. Last week N.Y.U. gained its 20th Intercollegiate Fencing Association championship.

The Violets won two of the three individual titles today at Johns Hopkins University. Pete Westbrook, a junior from Newark, posted a 23-0 record to gain the saber crown, while Risto Hurme, a sophomore from Finland, took the épée title with 21-2.

Jim Bonacorda, the third Violet entry, a junior, finished fourth in foil, which was won by Brooke Makler of Penn.

"What makes this title so much more meaningful to me," said Castello, "is that all of the three kids who competed today will be back next year."
