

N.Y.U. Leads Title Fencing By 3 Points

CLEVELAND, March 29—New York University held a 3-point lead over Wayne State after the second day of competition in the 30th National Collegiate Athletic Association fencing championships at Case Western Reserve University.

N.Y.U., the defending champion, and Wayne State reached a standoff in foil and saber, each with 24 victories. The Violets won three more épée bouts than did Wayne State for a total of 64 points. Penn held third place with 53.

Peter Westbrook of N.Y.U., Steve Danosi of Wayne State and Tom Losonszy of Columbia were each unbeaten in 12 saber bouts, setting the stage for a showdown in tomorrow's final round. Westbrook captured the individual N.C.A.A. saber crown last year, while Danosi finished second. Losonszy was the runner-up to Westbrook in the Eastern championships this year.

Wayne State's George Benko and N.Y.U.'s Jim Bonacorda each had 12-0 won-lost records in foil. Johan Ackerman of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, the Eastern foil champion, had an 11-1 mark. Richard Jacques of Air Force led the épée by capturing 11 of 12 bouts.
