Highlights

Nittany Lions Notch Another Title: Penn State used outstanding performances from its women in all three weapons and a pair of top-four efforts from its men to record its sixth consecutive championship March 23-26 at Stanford.

The Nittany Lions ended with a team score of 175 points, edging runners-up Notre Dame and St. John's by four points.

Jessica Burke highlighted the Nittany Lions' women's showing by winning the individual epee championship, and teammate Daniel Landgren captured the men's epee competition.

Stanford's Felix Reichling repeated as the men's foil champion and MIT's Caroline Purcell became the first women's sabre champion as competition in that event debuted.

Note: In 1990, team scoring was based on standings in weapon team events. In 1991, the scoring system was expanded to allow fencers not qualifying as part of a team to contribute points to team standings through their individual performances. As a result, point values for weapon team standings increased. In 1995, weapon team events were eliminated, and team scoring was based on performance in the individual events. Women's epee was added as fifth weapon. Starting in 1998, team scoring was based on a one-point system. In 2000, women's sabre was added as sixth weapon.
