Note: In 1990, team scoring was based on standings in weapon team events. In 1991, the scoring system was expanded to allow fencers not qualifying as part of a team to contribute points to team standings through their individual performances. As a result, point values for weapon team standings increased. In 1995, weapon team events were eliminated and team scoring was based on performance in the individual events, and women's epee was added as fifth weapon. Starting in 1998, team scoring was based on a one-point system. In 2000, women's sabre was added as sixth weapon.
