

FENCING MASTER DEAD

Louis Vauthier, Who Taught at
West Point 38 Years, Was 92

BERGENFIELD, N. J., March 17 — Louis Vauthier, retired instructor in fencing and French at West Point, died today at his home here. His age was 92.

Mr. Vauthier, who had been a Master of the Sword in France, had been at the academy for thirty-eight years before he retired on April 30, 1942. His length of service was believed to have set a record for fencing instructors.

Under his tutelage West Point teams won nine of eleven inter-collegiate fencing championships, and Mr. Vauthier was regarded as a foremost authority in this country in his field.
