FENCING MASTER DEAD

Louis Vauthier, Who Taught at West Point 38 Years, Was 92

BERGENFIELD, N. J., March 17—Louis Vauthier, retired instructor in fencing and French at West Point, died today at his home here. His age was 92.

Mr. Vauthier, who had been a Master of the Sword in France, had been at the academy for thirty-eight years before he retired on April 30, 1942. His length of service was believed to have set a record for fencing instructors.

Under his tutelage West Point teams won nine of eleven intercollegiate fencing championships, and Mr. Vauthier was regarded as a foremost authority in this country in his field.
