Although Sohlberg and Cocroft won, their work had not the finish nor the sureness of the touch they displayed last season, but the Army is confident that both men will shortly round into the fine form they showed in the last intercollegiate meet. Dargue, although a new man on the team, gave an exhibition that was exceedingly gratifying to the instructors. In the last round Strong was substituted for Cocroft in order to give him experience, and he won his bout from Sternfeld handily. Parker of the Pennsylvania team did the best work for his team, and gave a good exhibition of swordsmanship. Considering hibition of sworusmanning that Pennsylvania defeated Yale and that Pennsylvania to the strong Turncame out second to the strong Turn-Verein team in the match for the Man-rique Cup, it must be seen that Pennsyl-vania is not such a weak team as the score would indicate, and the Soldiers' overwhelming victory charge volume overwhelming victory speaks volumes for the cadets in the forthcoming final intercollegiate meet this year.
