

Fencing News

Message From The Chair

Since my last message in *The Sword*, I've met a wide range of members at Roadshows and events, in Scotland, Wales and England. I have Ireland, the Isle of Man and other places to come. If you have a venue or club you would like to be involved in the Roadshow programme, please do let me know. As usual the contact details are at the end here.

The Roadshows are a very simple concept. Basically it's me, as your Chair, turning up at a venue or event to chat to a group of members, or do a series of one-to-one encounters. The aim is to exchange views and news. I can update members on the new Board, on Green, Grow and Gold, on the 2024 goals, etc, whatever people want to ask about. Mostly I just listen to members' opinions, needs, experience. The insights I get are invaluable; essential is a better word. There is always passion – thank goodness! Often, I find misunderstandings, and it's good to clear those up. Always, I get very good advice. It's usually polite!

Let's give one example. At the Camden club recently, several parents got me in a corner on the future for their children – especially those who are epee fencers. They asked me, what chance do they have, with all the emphasis on foil? I respect the question. Because the downside for any sport working with UK Sport, with its well known 'no compromise' approach, is that there is no easy way to get funding support where we can't demonstrate world class achievement or potential. So your Chair and Board have to accept that the world class programme must be foil led for the short term – that is the only way to attract that UK Sport funding, advice and support which is critical to our Gold ambitions.

What I make clear in such discussions is the Board's policy and direction. We are a six-weapon sport. There is no BF compromise on that fact. So, we must work hard at developing all our athletes, young and mature, in epee and sabre as well as foil. We don't yet have enough funding – but, we are not for turning. As an immediate example, the Board is launching soon a new BF Fund that will give practical support to young fencers, male and female, epee, sabre or foil.

Wherever I go, I talk always about our 2024 goals. I'm glad to say, these broadly have been well received by members. You all recognise that the goals are very ambitious. We don't have the track record to aspire to be the world's leading fencing nation, or to be considered Britain's best National Governing Body, or to have 50,000 members. But members have said to me – why not? Generally, there is backing for our setting hard targets for British Fencing.

What's clear is that achieving any one of the goals will require a major effort. It demands change. It will depend upon finding new ways to present and sell our sport;

recruiting and training more and better coaches, referees, administrators; helping the club network to provide great customer service and thus expand; putting in place a really effective talent pathway; developing and honing the reserves of talent we have, at all ages.


This major challenge will require strong effective leadership. With eight new Board Directors elected *by you, the members* (out of 18 who stood for election), the Board is working hard to rebuild trust and start delivering the changes necessary to meet our goals. I was very pleased that the members gave such a clear sign of trust at the recent May General Meeting (GM), where the Board's two resolutions received overwhelming support.

I can tell you, working with this new Board is a demanding pleasure. Why? There is a new focus on service and results; a clear determination to make a difference; there is a team ethic; and there is bags of knowledge about fencing and the fencing community and a deep love of the sport.

So, to achieve change, to move fast forward, British Fencing can claim to have some building blocks in place. First and foremost is the new Board. Second is improved governance, thanks to the GM decisions and the hard work already, driven by John Troiano and his new Audit Governance & Risk Committee. Third is the quiet revolution in Head Office administration being put in place by Peter King, an experienced and effective sporting CEO who knows how to lay foundations for success. Fourth is the commitment and ability throughout the sport.

But we need more clear steps forward – for example, we have to secure the further three years of funding and support from Sport England and UK Sport; the decisions come in December. We need to get our Coaching and Refereeing Committees up and running effectively. We have to make the new Talent Pathway work. We must keep enhancing the coaching and other support for our Podium Potential athletes. We have to improve the membership scheme. The whole fencing community has to get involved. The list is long. Do keep writing or calling me with your items for the 'must do better' list. Your BF Board is listening – with care and determination.

WORLD CLASS PROGRAMME

For the next four-year cycle, to the Rio Olympic Games, UK Sport (UKS) has increased the overall funding for fencing from £2,529,335 (2009-13) to £3,082,800 (2013-17).

For the first year (1 April 2013 – 31 March 2014), 12 ‘podium potential’ places have been allocated to British Fencing under the World Class Programme (WCP). Funding for the remaining three years will depend on UKS’s autumn review, which will consider whether the sport has demonstrated improvements in its governance and implemented a performance system. This year funding is focused on men’s and women’s foil and women’s epee. Initially seven places were allocated to the following: James Davis, Richard Kruse, Rhys Melia, Marcus Mepstead, Husayn Rosowsky, Natalia Sheppard and Corinna Lawrence. These fencers are operating within a pseudo-podium programme in centralised training in Lee valley. In addition another five men foilists have been nominated as part of a podium potential squad. They are: Acland Bryant, Jamie Fitzgerald, Tom Hendrie, Amol Rattan and Alex Tofalides. In addition Kristjan Archer has been included as part of the programme, although from August he will be training and studying in the USA.

All fencers on the WCP are eligible for a UKS lottery-funded Athlete Performance Award as shown in the table below.

Performance Director Alex Newton said, “Technically all the athletes would be eligible to receive a D-level award as they are all part of a squad whose team is based in the top 10 or an individual in the top 50 of the world rankings. But given that we are trying to fast track the more senior athletes on to the podium programme and also operate a true podium potential programme, all the athletes have been signed off at different levels by UKS based on their assessment of their potential at this time and a commitment to the training and competition plan.”

As part of a programme to produce a continuous stream of talented youngsters across all six weapons, Joanna Wray has been appointed as Head of Pathway Development. She has degrees in sport and exercise psychology and previously worked for Taekwondo GB, leading the development of the National Academy.

To further support the Board ambitions to become a leading fencing nation by 2024, Pat Aiyenuro and Jon Willis have been appointed as voluntary weapon managers to work closely alongside the WCP and provide support to non-funded weapons; they will be responsible for putting together a training and competition programme of activity.

NEW RULES

1. Sabre Gloves

Because of a number of injuries in both Britain and abroad caused by sabre blades, unbroken as well as broken, penetrating the glove, the FIE is making a new specification glove mandatory for its competitions from 1st September 2013. This new glove has to provide a minimum protection of 800 Newtons, using the specified testing regime, on all parts of the hand from the wrist forward except the front of the fingers and half the front of the thumb.

The BF Board, on the recommendation of the Safety Committee, has therefore approved the introduction of these gloves for fencers using full size sabres as follows:

- all BF competitions (senior, junior, cadet, age-group) – from 1st September 2014.
- Universal UK application – from 1st September 2016.

When both fencers are using size 0, 2 or 3 blades, these gloves will be optional. See BF Clothing Rules – appended to the revised BF Safety Guidelines.

The Board believes that this represents a proportionate reaction to the accident risk set against the impact on fencers, clubs, schools and activity centres of having to replace sabre gloves earlier than usual. The Board will keep these dates under review in the light of any future incidents. There are no plans at present to extend this requirement to foil or epee.

2. Plastrons when fencing with size 0-3 blades at all weapons or non-electric foil blades

Presently, fencers using these weapons do not need to wear a plastron if they are wearing an 800 Newton jacket. From 1st September 2014 this will no longer be approved and this category will be removed from the Clothing Rules.

The reason for this change is because of some reports of the under-arm seams of 800N jackets coming apart, putting at risk this vulnerable area of the body – the area that a plastron is designed to protect.

So from 1st September 2014 the minimum level approved for those fencing with size 0-3 blades or with non-electric foil blades will be:

- either a 350 Newton jacket plus a 350 Newton plastron
- or a 350 Newton jacket which includes an integrated 350 Newton plastron.

FIE LOOKS TO THE FUTURE

The FIE is considering introducing shorter bouts as part of a modernisation drive reports the online sports publication *Inside The Games*. Frédéric Pietruszka, FIE secretary general, told reporter David Owen that the length of each of the three periods in an individual match could be cut from three minutes to two. He indicated that the switch could be made in time for the Rio Olympics in 2016. "We have noticed that the third and final leg of a match is often the most active", Pietruszka said.

The move is one of a series of changes, some quite radical, that might be adopted over time in an effort to make people think of fencing, in Pietruszka's phrase, as "a sport of the future". These could include more colourful clothing for athletes, innovative methods of making it clear to spectators when a point has been scored and by whom, and even the introduction of laser weapons. "At the moment the notion of using lasers is no more than a distant dream", Pietruszka cautioned, "but we do need to think about what our sport ought to look like in 20 years' time."

Fencing has been shocked by the IOC's decision to consider axing wrestling from the list of core Games sports after Rio. "If fencing lost its Olympic status, it would be the death of our sport", he said. "It is not just the money, although that is vital, but our credibility depends on being part of the Olympic programme. Would Mr [Alisher] Usmanov, our President, want to continue spending money to develop fencing worldwide if it were not an Olympic sport? I don't know."

The FIE expects to receive £8.3-£9 million from the IOC post-London 2012. "That is the equivalent of about two years' turnover for the FIE", Pietruszka said. "So, given that the Olympics has a four-year cycle, you could say that fencing's place at the Olympics produces approximately 50 percent of our income."

COLLECTORS' CORNER


The most lavishly illustrated treatise on fencing of the first half of the 18th century – Girard's *Traité sur le fait des armes*, 1736 – was the star item at an auction of fencing books held in Paris in April. Sumptuously bound in red morocco leather by the 19th century master binder Chambolle Duru, it sold for £3725.

But prices were generally low, perhaps because in recent years a glut of fencing books has been chasing a dwindling number of serious collectors. The collection on offer in Paris came from the library of François Chenu-Tournier, whom older fencers may remember as a fine epeeist who graced the final stages of the Challenge Martini on more than one occasion.

A first edition of Angelo's *L'Ecole des Armes*, 1763, in a contemporary binding went for £2900, good value considering a copy in a later binding is currently offered by a London dealer for more than twice as much. A German edition (1650) of Fabris's great work on the rapier was snapped up for £675, as was, *L'Exercice des Armes* by Le Perche (1750), half the price of a copy with two facsimile plates which was sold at auction 2½ years ago.

Several books with attractive bindings sold for well under £100 as buyers were able to pick up bargains, including Roger Ducret's account of how he won a gold and two silver medals at the 1924 Olympics, *D'Estoc et de Taille*, £40, the first book on the epee, La Marche's *Traité de l'épée*, 1884, in a ½-shagreen binding with gilt tooling, £72, and a signed copy of Letainturier-Fradin's illustrated history of duelling, *Le duel à travers les ages*, 1892, in another ½-shagreen binding for £52.

Just a minute

A look at half-time coaching and the techniques top coaches apply. Michael Clarke writes on the one-minute break in sabre fencing and the impact the coach can have, with research and an interview from sports performance coach Jon Rhodes.

Gone are the days in sport where a half-time orange would suffice as good second-half preparation. As coaches have more and more access to real-time data, the influence of technology has turned many big sports, such as rugby and football, into a numbers game. Half time is now a technology war, where players are overloaded visually with live statistics and video analysis.

At the top in fencing there has been a shift towards numbers, with British Fencing now working with a data analyst. Fencers on the world-class programme now have the chance to analyse their rivals through the use of archive footage and statistics. Data have advanced the building of a game plan before a fight in fencing, but the use of live data as a half-time tool in the sport is still at the trial stage.

The limitation of one minute for sabre fencing's 'half time' forces the coach's advice to be purely verbal and it has to be direct, concise and delivered eloquently. Jon Rhodes (MSc in sports performance) has studied the subject of the one-minute break and has begun to apply techniques to optimise the impact of the coach's advice.

"Let's focus on getting the most out of our athletes. I have been at the side of the piste many times to give advice and I have watched other coaches offer advice, whether it's at half time or during a minute break. The usual advice is 'relax', 'you just need to focus', and 'one hit at a time'. Everyone has a basic understanding of psychology, and fencing coaches could do better with their delivery pre-fight, but especially during the minute break."

Within the short period of 60 seconds a fencer commonly has to re-fuel, recover and take on board coaching advice. So how can coaches maximise this short period of time?

"Let us consider two fencers of similar ability going into the break at 8-7, with each fencer having a coach of similar coaching experience. Many times we have seen one fencer dominate after the break. It could be argued that what was said during the break was the turning point. Of course there are many variables, but the key factors are two-fold. Firstly, what advice is given to the fencer and secondly, does the fencer follow the advice?"

For his research, Rhodes carried out an international study focusing on coaches at the minute break. The study consisted of 22 fencing coaches (15 British, 4 Hungarian, 2 Japanese, and 1 Austrian) focusing on neurolinguistic programming (NLP) elements, which includes examining body language, tempo and tone of speech, eye contact and language used. From this study three main conclusions were drawn.

"The first conclusion with successful coaches is allowing the fencer time to solve their own problems. Coaches often jump in by offering the fencer a solution to scoring more hits rather than asking – "what do you think? More fencers given the opportunity to review their performance won the fight and were likely to follow coaching advice delivered in the last 30 seconds of the minute break."

Passive coaching is not always the most popular approach amongst coaches. However, creating a fencer that relies on his own judgement is down to the coach's ability to give responsibility to the fencer. A coach needs to achieve this by not overloading a fencer with information on how they see it, but rather by taking a more passive approach, which allows the fencer to figure out the options.

"Secondly, minimal information given in the minute break considerably aids the fencer. The magic number is three. One technical development (e.g., smaller parries), one tactical (e.g., pull the opponent) and one opponent awareness tip (e.g., watch out for counterattacks). More than three pieces of information will result in fencers not being able to remember what the coach said, slowed down reaction time and reverting to previous behaviour. Finally, generally the speed and firmness of information is equally important. As you would expect, slow and clear feedback is essential with a normal speaking voice. In two instances the fencers were shouted at, one fencer changed their style, the other did not. Therefore individual differences and situational variables are considered."

Giving advice to a fencer is obviously not a perfect science, as each individual will react differently to what they are being told. This is why the research focused on what words were commonly used in the one-minute break.

TRANSLATING SUCCESS

"It is worthwhile mentioning that the language used is of equal importance. World class coaches have the highest use of the word 'You' and ask the most questions during the breaks. Furthermore, most world class coaches offer only two pieces of development information to the fencer and use their body language to refocus the fencer by using visual cues."

Visual signs from the coach are a key aspect to success. A notable example of this is the French coach Christian Bauer, who successfully coached through a translator both the Chinese and Russian national sabre teams to numerous Olympic and major championship medals. The tactics never seem to get lost in translation, which indicates the idea and influence of not only the fencer's body language but also the coach's. As fencing becomes more and more universally recognisable, the role of the translator will become a more common sight on the international circuit.

The idea of the visual and simplification of complicated idea can be seen in the coaching of young fencers. Rhodes addresses this, saying: "For the majority of coaches working with junior fencers, I would suggest these three points to work on. 1) Ask your fencer what they need to do to beat their opponent? 2) Work with silence. Wait for a response, even if it takes 20 seconds. 3) Offer no more than two points of development and one awareness point and agree them with the fencer – what do they think? By doing this you are more likely to gain task cohesion and develop a critical problem solver with your fencer."

Technology will inevitably get quicker and more accessible, which may one day mean that the one-minute break will be aided with 'live-data'. However, as it stands, it is crucial that the coach conveys strong, clear, simple ideas to their fencer to optimise their result.

Jon Rhodes has worked with a variety of sports at both elite and amateur level for seven years including rugby, football, boxing, golf, tennis, kayaking and volleyball. After obtaining a Masters degree in 2007, he briefly worked for the LTA and at the British Judo Performance Institute before lecturing in colleges and universities. He has set up two performance academies and currently works with elite fencers, rugby players and golfers. Jon is currently the Performance Coach at Truro Fencing Club; performance director for the Guernsey Academy of Fencing; lecturer in sports psychology; and coaches worldwide at various clubs in both psychology and strength and conditioning.

The Play's the Thing –

An Interview with the Prince of Denmark

If you have not already seen the Royal Shakespeare Company's big summer offering of *Hamlet*, you are in for a treat. The production runs till early October, then transfers to Newcastle for a week. All the cast are splendid, none more so than the Prince himself, Jonathan Slinger, described by the *Guardian* as 'the RSC's brightest talent.' His readings are as good as, and often better, than any other Hamlet I have seen.

But the reason for his being interviewed in *The Sword* is something different. The production, directed by David Farr, takes place in the run-down fencing room of a private school, with Claudius its imperious headmaster. Hamlet is dressed in slightly unorthodox fencing kit for almost the entire play, while his father's ghost appears in similar costume, an odd quilted affair, and brandishes an old sabre. In one scene, Claudius is attended by the young women of his court, each carrying a mask and sword, while other cast members regularly seize a mask or weapon from the walls for comfort or emphasis. Decidedly offbeat, but interesting.

The final duel between Hamlet and Laertes is an electrifying affair (figuratively speaking: no Leon Paul boxes on display), with both actors giving a robust display of fencing technique before matters get out of hand amid much grappling and thrusting, and the usual slew of bodies.

So why present the whole play through the prism of fencing? Slinger – who last year played both Macbeth and Prospero, following earlier incarnations as Puck, a drag-queen Richard II and a gleefully malevolent Richard III – generously let us in on his thinking.

"David (Farr) realised that much of Hamlet's character could be defined in fencing terms. He uses his wit, his wordplay like a weapon. So we followed that", Slinger explains. "David wanted the play to be in modern dress, so the fencing had to be a traditionally recognisable thing. The time is no particular date – pre a lot of modern fencing technology, say the 1970s."

Jonathan Slinger as Hamlet

Slinger, born in April 1972, trained at RADA, where he first experienced fencing under the 'charismatic' Henry Marshall – "I was lucky enough to catch him for his last couple of years." So the world of foils and sabres was not a totally new one.

"We wanted the fencing to be as real and traditional as we could make it, within the confines of creating drama. Modern bouts are very un-dramatic – a couple of blisteringly quick moves and that's it." How, then, to make the duel look like a real bout, but also one that non-fencing audiences would find exciting? "I suggested to David Farr that I have lessons – and so I did, a total of maybe ten, each between an hour and three hours."

Fortuitously, just a hundred yards from the theatre lies King Edward VI School, where for 25 years the fencing coach has been David Kirby, one of the most respected masters in the Midlands region. Throughout his time at the school, Kirby had never set foot in the theatre for professional reasons, but he now became an eager partner in Slinger's attempts to become a convincing fencer.

"We started with foil", says the actor, "which I thought had a forensic quality, both fascinating and intricate; but we soon went on to sabre, as the weapon that creates the most drama."





Here I should intersperse the actor's comments with those of his new coach, whom I spoke to shortly afterwards. David Kirby recalls: "The first thing I asked was, 'I take it we're using foils. Which period?' 'What do you mean?' Jon said. I explained that, depending on weapon and the time the play is set in, it affects the way you move, and what you're doing changes. I said also that most productions put epee blades into whatever guard they had chosen, but that the most dramatic weapon was sabre, and it was also easier for the audience to follow. Foil is too subtle. So Jon and the director opted for sabre."

"I got him to watch the six-formers at the school fence, and he was amazed at the precision and power of these six-foot three-inch guys hurtling down the piste, then at the gentleness of their final hits. By the end of our lessons together we'd got him to the stage that he was like a real fencer – he'd taken in the character of it all, the timing and the etiquette, and in the play he looks like the real thing. I remember asking Jon how he managed to learn the huge number of lines, often of two plays he's in at once. He said getting the lines right was the easy bit – understanding the character was the hard part. I realised that my job was to get Jon to understand *sentiment du fer* – after that, he could act it. He had to get the feel of the thing."

Jon Slinger remembers it the same way. "The most difficult elements – which seemed to my body counter-intuitive – were things crucial to actual fencing, but which were different to drama-school fencing as we were taught it. I found the whole hand-foot coordination tricky. Going forward, I wanted to move my back foot first, and going back my front foot, whereas of course in fencing you do the opposite. Moving hand and foot independently of each other is so hard. David would emphasise the angle of my wrist when I attacked – something that is never talked about normally when you do stage fights. He also kept on at me about 'leading with the tip' – I'm still not sure what he meant! But I really enjoyed the sessions. One of the things I love about fencing is that, although I don't play chess, it's like chess in that you have to think several moves ahead. The possibilities, the combinations you can put together, seem endless."

A good duel scene is still a partnership. "Stage duels are all about a rhythm that you set", he explains. The RSC never uses actual fencers in productions. "They're trained to riposte immediately and go for the target. We don't do either. We're taught to aim at an imaginary big red balloon to the right or left of the person we're fighting."

Jon also did some research of his own, which included watching *The Duellists*, the 1972 film directed by Ridley Scott, with fight scenes choreographed by William Hobbs. "What I loved about those scenes, which take up about half the movie, was the tension – those extended moments before anyone makes a move that seemed to go on forever."

Jon is now 40, and not obviously an athletic type. How was he going to imitate a prince described in the play as an exceptional fencer? "David said the best fencers often have an inherent understanding of rhythm, and that there is a real correlation between rhythm and fencing. He was also adamant that I had to be better than Laertes. But our Laertes – Luke Norris – is naturally good at sports and at least ten years younger than I am." So Jon kept David Kirby to himself, and Laertes polished his skills at a South London fencing club instead.

The Hamlet-Laertes duel is conducted with such speed and fury that I wondered if there had been any accidents yet. "Well, I nearly lost an eye during rehearsals for *Macbeth*, when Macbeth has a duel with McDuff. After one move, we hadn't made eye contact with each other again, and the tip of his blade nicked my right eyelid – I must have been blinking at the time, so I was lucky.

"When we were rehearsing *Hamlet*, sometimes I'd congratulate myself on a parry and completely forget to riposte. Then, during the duel one night on stage, we lost our way halfway through – a bit like 'dying,' when you forget your lines – and we just stood there waving our swords wildly at one another until eventually we got back into the routine." But they did – with a vengeance. Just how well you can see for yourselves.





Dissecting the Epee Lunge

The Sports Science and Applied Fencing Research Group, recently formed by Lindsay Bottoms, Jonathan Sinclair and Andrew Greenhalgh, has been looking at two aspects of the epee lunge: what determines sword velocity (study 1) and what gender differences there are in lower body movement (study 2). To investigate the factors influencing sword velocity, we recruited 14 epeeists. They were each fitted with reflective markers on both the upper and lower body, as well as on the epee, and these markers were then recorded on 3D motion-capture cameras (see figure). This enabled joint angles and velocities to be recorded during the lunge. The findings confirmed what may seem obvious: that sword velocity is determined by the amount of flexion in the back leg at the beginning of the lunge (i.e. how low fencers are in their stance) and also by the extent to which the back leg straightens during the lunge. But the study also found that hip flexion of the leading leg is important, suggesting that sword velocity is also determined by the propulsion of the front leg during the lunge. In addition, the quicker the arm extends, the greater the sword velocity. Finally, flexion at the shoulder is important, such that the hit needs to be aimed at the opponent's shoulder level to achieve highest sword velocity. This research fits current coaching which advocates having the arm high and aiming for the upper chest during the lunge. It shows that it is important to focus strength and conditioning on both back and front leg (i.e. hamstring and quadriceps) and shoulder flexor muscles, which are deltoids (shoulder) and latissimus dorsi (mid-back).

Eight male and eight female club-level epeeists volunteered to take part in study 2. As with study 1, reflective markers were attached to anatomical landmarks on the lower body and were recorded using 3D motion-capture cameras during the lunge. The results showed that there were no differences in the back leg between genders. However, in females the knee was pushed out sideways away from the body more at the end of the lunge compared to males, as well as their hips rotating inwards. This could lead to females being at greater risk of knee injuries. Unfortunately, this occurs due to the nature of the human skeleton in females and therefore it is not possible to correct in the fencer. But it is possible to stop exacerbating the situation, and coaches and fencers should be aware of the position of the knee and hip during the lunge.

Early Fencing Photographs




Fig. 2 – from the Badminton Library, 1889

Since the French inventor Joseph Nicéphore Niépce took the world's first photograph in 1825, it took only about 30 years for photography to become a product for mass consumption. The earliest known fencing photograph is a portrait of a mid-19th century French fencer dated 1858 (Fig. 1). In the 1860s, another pioneering photographer, the French writer Felix Nadar, took the first posed action images of fencing, although they did not appear in a manual until nearly 30 years later (Fig. 2). Soon pictures of fencers individually and in groups, taken in studios and outside, became popular subjects, as Figs. 3-6 show.

The first epee team match between England and France, held at Blenheim Palace in 1901, was the subject of a fine series of photographs taken by the Oxford photographers Hills & Saunders (Figs. 7-9). At the same time, the redoubtable Toupie Lowther, generally considered to be the best female fencer in the world, was taking part in display matches against all-comers (Fig. 10). In 1902 the first mixed demonstration of fencing between men and women was held at Oxford town hall (Fig. 11).

Round-Up

VETS NEWS

European Championships (*photos: Gillian Aghajan*)

Two years ago Britain topped the medal table at the European championships, but this year in Terni, Italy, we slipped to sixth place, with one gold, four silvers and eight bronzes. Star of the show was newcomer Georgina Usher, who was in a league of her own in the Cat 1 women's epee, emerging from the poules as No. 1 seed and sailing through the DEs with scores of 10-3, 10-2, 10-4, 10-7 and 10-4 to reach the final, where she demolished former senior world silver and bronze medallist Gianna Hablützel-Bürki of Switzerland 10-5 to take gold.

Malcolm Cawton came closest to winning another gold medal, just losing 9-10 in the Cat 4 men's sabre final to the formidable Russian Gari Aftandilov. Janet Cooksey won two more silver medals, in Cat 4 women's foil and epee, on both occasions finishing runner-up to the legendary Marie-Chantal Demaille of France, who made a clean sweep of all her events. The fourth silver went to Vivien Frith, who knocked out team-mate Yvonne Walls in the semi-finals of the Cat 3 women's sabre, before losing to Italy's Iris Gardini in the final.

Richard Cohen's extraordinary run of nine European gold medals – every championship he has entered – had to come to an end at some point and this year was it, as he went down to Michel Bellet (FRA) in the semi-finals of the Cat 3 men's sabre and had to be content with bronze.

Chris Green fought a shrewd series of Cat 4 men's epee DE matches after a shaky start in the poules, eliminating former European champion Wolfgang Fischer (GER) 10-6 after being 4-6 down and then denying No.1 seed Aftandilov another medal by edging him out 4-3 in a slow-scoring quarter-final before falling to Alberto Beonio Brocchieri (ITA).

The irrepressible Connie Adam, at 85 the oldest fencer at the championships, scored three victories in her 11-strong Cat 4 women's epee poule and then won two DE fights 10-9 before losing to Janet Cooksey 1-3 and finishing with a bronze. She collected another by being one of only four Cat 4 women to appear with sabre in hand.

Other women sabreurs winning bronze were Jane Hutchison (Cat 2), Lynne Bornemisza and Yvonne Walls (Cat 3) and Sylvia Brown (Cat 4).

JUNIOR WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Following their bronze medal in the junior European championships (see *The Sword*, April 2013, p. 32), the GB men's foil team put in another outstanding performance at the junior world championships to finish fourth. The team of Kristjan Archer, Amol Rattan, Alex Tofalides and Jai Birch fenced their hearts out to get Britain's best ever junior world championship team result. The quartet beat China 45-39 in the last 16 and Hungary 45-33 in the quarter-finals before narrowly losing to the USA 41-45 in the semis. They were unable to recover from that match in time for the bronze medal fight off and lost to Russia 37-45. "What a fantastic performance", said coach Pierre Harper. "The boys deserved their placing due to the outstanding results achieved in the individual event, where all three got into the top 16 – the only team to do so."

NEWHAM HAS BEST EVER SEASON

Newham Swords Fencing Club, run by Pierre Harper and Linda Strachan, is celebrating its best season, following achievements at GB cadet and junior level, as well as on the world stage.

The club took the U17 and U20 men's foil national titles, the London U17 BSC foil trophy and the Gateshead U20 BSC foil title.

Eleven of the club's fencers were selected for the GB cadet and junior squads, and four qualified for the England U15 team. Of these, four managed to qualify for the cadet/junior European and world championships. The younger fencers also performed well by making it through to the BYC finals (as part of a squad of 18 club fencers), where seven of them managed to win medals at every age-group in the competition. Many of these young fencers have won medals at all the major junior foil events, namely the Leon Paul Junior Series and the Premier Series.

On the international scene, Jai Birch finished as Britain's No. 1 cadet, following his results at U17 home and foreign competitions. Amol Rattan and Kristjan Archer ended their junior season with outstanding results at both the European junior championships (taking a bronze medal in the team event) and at the worlds. Amol got the best individual British result at the world championships (7th place) and joined Kristjan and Jai (as well as Alex Tofalides) in achieving a top four finish in the team event.

"This tremendous success is not just down to talent", said head coach, Pierre Harper. "It has also come about through sheer hard work on everyone's part and a strong desire to win, as well as from training in a supportive, disciplined and fun environment." "We are very proud of them all", added club manager, Linda Strachan.





