

COLUMBIA FENCERS LEAD.

Blue and White Follsmen Win Three Intercollegiate Championships.

Columbia carried off all the honors at the intercollegiate fencing tournament, which was finished at the Hotel Astor last night. The blue and white team not only won the team championships, but Steddford Pitt carried off the individual championship, and Waldo Shumway, also Columbia, won the sabre championship. The sabre matches were an innovation, as there had heretofore never been a sabre competition in connection with the intercollegiate fencing tournament. R. F. Hans of the United States Naval Academy made a strong bid for the individual championship, and was not out of the running until the very last bout, which happened to be between him and Pitt. Pitt won this last bout decisively, by a score of 5 to 2, making a total record of 13 wins and 2 defeats.

It looked for a while during the afternoon fencing that the Columbia team, which had obtained a big lead in the first night's matches, might be beaten out by the Navy men. Several wins by Pitt gave them back their lead, however. With two victories less than Columbia, the Navy had an opportunity to win out at the end, as three of the last five bouts were between Columbia and Navy men. While Glennon of the Navy defeated Mouquin of Columbia, his team-mate, Ellsberg, was defeated by Clough, so that the final bout between Pitt and Hans could not affect the team standing.

Hans and H. Van Buskirk of Pennsylvania were tied for second place in the individuals, with 11 wins and 4 defeats.

During the afternoon P. W. Allison, one of the judges, was badly cut under the eye by the sabre of E. L. Cochrane of the Navy team. Allison has had particularly bad luck in the last couple of weeks, as he has been hurt at fencing matches three times. While fencing as a competitor in the national foils championships last week he was cut in the shoulder when a foil broke. Allison was attended by Dr. Graeme Hammond. It was found that his eye was not seriously hurt. Allison is a former Cornell fencing Captain. The summary:

Tamura Shows Form with Cue.

T. Tamura, the Japanese billiardist who is opposing local players in exhibition matches of 18.2 balk-line billiards at Keeney's Billiard Academy in Brooklyn, last night displayed a noticeable improvement over his form in previous matches, when he defeated Charles E. White, the Brooklyn amateur, by the score of 200 to 108. The Japanese player completed his string of 200 points in seventeen innings for an average of 11 13-17 points. He maintained a safe advantage practically throughout the game and chalked up high runs of 34 and 26 twice. White also played in good form, making high runs of 24, 18, and 10, with an average of 8 6-17. Tamura will continue his exhibitions throughout the coming week.
