NAVY FENCERS WIN TITLES WITH FOILS

Capture Team and Individual Championships in Tourney at Hotel Astor.

IS DOUBLE VICTOR YALE

Takes Epec and Sabre Team Honors ---Applebaum of Penn and Wolf of Yale Individual Winners.

The historic Iron Man, emblematic of the intercollegiate foils championship and one of the most treasured trophies in the college fencing world, was carried off last night by the Midshipmen from the United States Naval Academy in the final bouts at the Hotel Astor. Navy's foils team went through its five matches without a defeat, conquering the Hamilton swordsmen by a score of 5 to 4 in the last encounter and winning the championship.

The individual foils championship also went to the Navy, with Stubbs winning the honors which last year went to Lane of Harvard. Stubbs went through eleven bouts and lost only two of them. Levis of M. I. T., Lynch of the Army and Dur-ham of Harvard tied for second place, Levis winning the runner-up position in the fence-off and Lynch taking third place. Yale won both the team epee cham-

pionships, the Blue team winning all of its live matches and losing not more than one bout in each. The individual honors with dueling sword, however, were captured by Applebaum of Pennsylvania, who defeated Edward Mengel of Yale in the fence-off after each had finished his regular bouts, with a record of ten victories and two defeats. Yale also won the team sabre cham-

pionship and Gordon Wolf of the Blue team captured the individual title, giving Yale three of the six titles in all. The Yale sabre team won all four of its bouts and the Army and Columbia were the only opponents to score against the fencers from New Haven, each getting one bout. The Navy finished second in the competition and the Army was third. Strange to say, none of the championships were taken by either of the ser-

vice schools, Annapolis and West Point, which have been famous for the swordsmen which they produce. The bouts were staged in the grand ballroom of the Hotel Astor and the inclosure was packed to capacity with spectators. The chairs were banked six

deep around the two strips on which the bouts were fenced, while the balcany boxes also were filled with enthusiasts. Not until after midnight did the final bouts come to an end, but the spectators then took the floor for the annual dance of the Intercollegiate Fencing Associa-The summaries follow: SABRE CHAMPIONSHIPS.
