

# WEBER IS WINNER IN FOILS TOURNEY

New York A. C. Entrant Takes  
Clemens Medal in Annual  
Novice Competition.

## ANNEXES 7 OF 9 MATCHES

Scores in Final on Touches After  
Tying With Robinson and Slade  
on Bout Record.

Fred R. Weber of the New York Athletic Club annexed the Clemens Medal in the annual novice fencing competition for this coveted prize at the Winged Foot Club last night. Weber lost only two of nine matches with the foils. A field of nineteen competed.

Weber, who was graduated from West Point in 1930 and comes from Kalamazoo, Mich., tied in the final with S. E. Slade, a freshman at Yale, and Robert F. Robinson, a senior at Columbia, each winning four of their six bouts. But Weber had eighteen touches against him, while Slade had twenty-three and Robinson twenty-four.

### Precedes College Event.

This competition, which has come to serve as a forerunner to the annual championship of the Intercollegiate Fencing Association which gets under way today at the Hotel Commodore, attracted a strong field.

After winning his three preliminary bouts with ease, Weber disposed of Marvin Coles of City College, 5-2, Camillo Locasto of St. John's College and Leonard Leight of City College by 5-1 margins and Slade by 5-4. He received his first tournament defeat at the hands of Robinson, 5-3, and also lost to Conway Williams of Columbia in a hard-fought bout, 5-4.

### Beaten Also by Williams.

Slade conquered Coles, 5-2, and Locasto and Robinson by 5-4 scores and Leight by 5-3, but in addition to losing to Weber was beaten by Williams, 5-3. Robinson triumphed over Weber and went on to win from Locasto, 5-1; Leight, 5-3, and Williams, 5-4, but lost to Slade and Coles.
