

N.Y.U. Completes Rare Sweep In Intercollegiate Fencing Meet

WEST POINT, N. Y., March 13—Bruce Soriano, a 20-year-old pre-med student at Columbia University, won all 17 of his saber matches today to emerge as the star of the Intercollegiate Fencing Association championships.

New York University swept the team championships in all three weapons, only the second team to do so in the 40-year history of the event. N.Y.U. had 88 points, Columbia was second with 73 and Navy third with 71.

Soriano beat 12 opponents in the team saber competition,

then defeated five competitors for the individual title.

Lawrence Cetrulo of Harvard, second to Soriano last year, came the closest in beating him today. Cetrulo led, 4-1, during the team competition, but Soriano came back with four straight touches.

George Szunyogh of N.Y.U. defeated Peter Solecki of Navy, 5-2, in a fence-off for the individual épée title. Ed Ballinger of N.Y.U. was undefeated winning the individual foil crown.

The George L. Cointe Award for sportsmanship went to Thomas Keller, a senior from Harvard who was fourth in individual foil competition.
