

NAVY FENCERS TAKE HONORS AT N. Y. A. C.

Navy won the tetragonal fencing tournament at the New York Athletic Club yesterday. The midshipmen captured a total of fifty-four bouts with the three weapons—*épée*, foil and saber.

Princeton was the runner-up with forty-three victories. Yale and Harvard followed with thirty-seven and twenty-eight, respectively.

Ted Parker of Navy, using a saber, was the only fencer to win all nine of his bouts.

Kristips Keggi of Yale won the foil honors and Allan Hoffman of Princeton was the *épée* leader. Each had an 8-1 record.

Navy won the team competitions in the foil and saber, gaining nineteen victories with each weapon. Princeton topped the *épée* teams with seventeen triumphs. Navy was the defending champion in the tournament that was a pentagonal affair until Army dropped the sport last fall.
