TRAINING GRANTS FOR YOUNG FENCERS

Talented young fencers across London and South East England are invited to apply for a series of financial and training grants being offered by the GLL Sport Foundation. They have until 13th February to apply for funding of up to £1500 to be spent on training, travel and equipment during the next 12 months.

Four categories of award are available: Ambassador – up to £1500 for fencers ranked in the top four of the senior national team; Talent (16-23 years) – up to £1000 for fencers ranked in the top five of the junior/senior national team; Development (12-20 years) – up to £500 for fencers ranked in the top five of their age group; Potential (12-16 years) – up to £250 for fencers ranked in the top eight of their age group.

To be eligible for a grant, sportsmen and women must reside or have a training base in a London or South East borough in which GLL operates and must have the long-term potential to succeed at international level. Since its launch in 2008 the Foundation has rolled out to cover more areas in South East England. For the first time in 2011, athletes living in Chiltern, South Bucks, South Oxfordshire, West Oxfordshire, Crawley and Mid Sussex districts will also be eligible to apply for funding.

COACH AWARD

Sportscoach UK selected Iain Aberdeen as one of the three finalists for Performance Development Coach of the Year. The award recognises coaches who have excelled and shown outstanding commitment to sport whilst providing innovative coaching practice and high quality coaching of young performers. Coaching fencing across the North East of England, Iain has worked with numerous young Great Britain squad fencers, as well as wheelchair fencers.

SATISFACTION SURVEY

Sport England's second sport satisfaction survey was carried out last summer. This time 884 fencers took part – 770 affiliated club members, 73 general fencers and 41 talent pool members. Of the total, 43% fenced foil, 34% epee and 18% sabre, and 5% were officials. Among club members two-thirds were male and one third female, but the talent pool was divided almost 50-50.

Since the first survey in 2009, all sports showed a drop in their overall satisfaction score; for fencing it fell from 78.8 to 76.3, a fraction below the average for all sports of 76.5

(down from 80 first time round). Unsurprisingly, the least satisfied among the fencers were the talent pool who recorded a score of only 72.3 – lower than the talent pools in any of the other 30 sports surveyed bar one (snowsports). They were particularly dissatisfied with the opportunities to improve their performance, the quality of officials and general value for money.

Ten criteria were evaluated – opportunity to improve performance, exertion & fitness, release & diversion, social aspects, people & staff, ease of participation, facilities & playing conditions, coaching, officials and value for money. The domain that had the most impact on overall satisfaction with fencing was social aspects, followed by performance, people & staff, exertion & fitness and ease of participation.

Over the past 12 months, 42% of fencers reported an increase in participation, 26% no change and 33% a decrease, with the talent pool showing the greatest increase – 68%.

CHRISTOPHER WHITESIDE TROPHY

Following the death of Trooper Christopher Whiteside in Afghanistan, British Fencing North West Region wanted to remember his sacrifice and celebrate his life. The committee decided to commission a trophy in his name to be presented to the best male sabreur at the Manchester Open, one of the newer competitions on the fencing calendar.

Christopher had been training at Blackpool Fencing Club. He was serving in The Light Dragoons Battle Group when he was killed by an improvised explosive device in Afghanistan's Helmand province on the 7th July 2009. He had been taking part in a task force operation to clear an area of insurgents and restore government control before the national elections in August.

The trophy was first presented to Niall Dowse in 2010 and, due to its importance and significance, I asked the region if I could take it down to Christopher's regiment near Dereham in Norfolk, where it would be held in trust amongst the other regimental silver and trophies. The North West Region agreed and so on a very snowy morning in November my husband and I made the journey to Norfolk. We were welcomed by WO I Simon Stott (RSM) and Sergeant Rick Black who showed us around the Warrant Officers' and Sergeants' mess and the magnificent collection of silverware. The trophy was put in a prominent position on a table, and looked very well there. We were then shown the beautiful new war memorial at the camp, and the wreath that Christopher's mother had laid for her son the previous week. This sad occasion brought home to me the importance of remembrance and service, and the support for the families of the fallen.

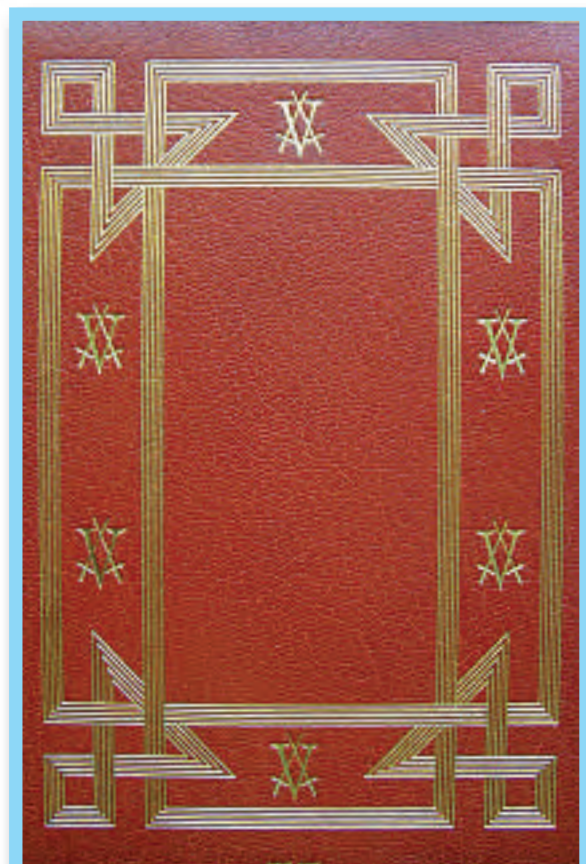

COLLECTORS' CORNER

Another fine collection of fencing books was sold by Adams of Amsterdam in October. Top prices were achieved by a rare copy of the first Dutch work on fencing by Bruchius, 1671, in a contemporary mottled calf binding, £5640; beautifully illustrated first editions of Capoferro, 1610, and Senese, 1660, each in contemporary limp vellum bindings and each selling for £4620; Agrippa, 1553, in a gold-tooled vellum binding, £4500; a curious Spanish/Italian manual by Texedo, 1678, in limp vellum, £4100; and a fine copy of Kahn, 1739, in blind-tooled red morocco, £3400.

Lower down the price scale, but in the best binding of all – sumptuous blue morocco outer covers with richly geometrical patterned inner covers in red morocco by the master binder Marius Michel – was Vigeant's story of the legendary French fencing master Jean-Louis, *Un maître d'armes sous la Restauration*, 1883, which sold for £1130. Another fine binding, this one blind-tooled red morocco by the English specialist Bumpus of Oxford St, was

wrapped around a second printing of George Roland's treatise that appeared in 1824 and was good value at £720.

There were also some real bargains. A Marozzo with full-page woodcut illustrations, undated but believed to be the second edition of 1540 (and there are few works of fencing literature much earlier), went for a mere £1000; and the first six years of the bi-monthly illustrated review *L'Escrime Francaise*, 1889-1894, was a snip at £360.

FENCING FILM WANTED

British Fencing already has a substantial archive of film showing fencing tournaments from the 1970s onwards, but seeks other examples of fencing on film in 8 mm or 16 mm format. The aim is to copy all the film to DVD and then produce an edited compilation of fencing through the decades. News from the President



Since my last report, we have had a great deal of international as well as domestic fencing activity. Following the Board's decision and to answer several questions on this topic, Piers Martin, our CEO, is responsible for the delivery of all operational matters, such as competitions, international trips, BFA committees and the competition calendar. The Board is now designed to be strategic and look at governance. Our committees and above all our salaried staff and consultants are responsible for the effective and successful delivery of all activities. For example, the International Committee is responsible for international fencing, each Weapon Committee for its individual weapon, the Referees' Committee for all refereeing matters and the Competitions and Calendar Committee for delivery of both these activities. I hope this explains the roles of the Board and everyone else.

INTERNATIONAL FENCING

The Junior European Championships were held in Lobnya, Russia. My thanks to our team manager, Linda Strachan, who coped with the many challenges. Congratulations to Mavis Thornton, who was selected as President of the *Directoire Technique*. Our fencers performed well and, in particular, congratulations to Husayn Rosowsky for winning an individual bronze medal at men's foil. Alex Tofalides and Jamie Fitzgerald both made the top eight. Amy Radford also made the top eight in women's epee. At sabre Curtis Miller and Sophie Williams both made the top 16. In the team events our women's

sabre team was 6th, men's sabre and women's epee were 7th and the men foilists won the bronze medal. Thus, Great Britain was ranked 8th in Europe after these championships. Our men's foil teams have now won silver at Cadet level, bronze at Junior level and bronze at Senior level. Other very pleasing results have been the winning of the silver medal by our women's epee team in the European Cadet circuit event at Grenoble. Jack Hudson was 2nd in the Cadet men's epee in Chalons and Jenny McGeever was 3rd in the women's epee Junior World Cup in Bratislava. Sophie Williams and Jessica Davies were joint 3rd in the Junior World Cup in Madrid, with Sophie adding a 5th place in the Junior World Cup in Dormagen. James Honeybone also achieved a top 16 in Dormagen. Daniel Ming had a superb day at the Cadet men's epee European circuit competition in Bonn, coming 7th. I would like to thank all the weapon captains and officials for their hard work in organising and taking these trips. Clare Halsted also deserves real credit for doing all she has to help Cadet and Junior international fencing.

EDEN CUP/LEON PAUL CUP

My thanks to Jon Milner for co-ordinating two major men's foil events – the Eden Cup Junior World Cup and the Leon Paul FIE satellite. Also thanks to the armoury team led by Peter Huggins, the doctors (Clare Halsted and Gareth Bashir), all the referees and Rodney Francis for continuing to support fencing and running the competition. It was good

to see Katie Dolan helping so effectively in her new role. The results were very impressive. In the Eden Cup Jamie Fitzgerald, James Davis and Kristjan Archer all made the top eight. In the Leon Paul, James Davis was 2nd and Keith Cook 3rd, with James Beevers, Marcus Mepstead and Peter Holder all making the top eight.

WORLD VETERAN CHAMPIONS

Many congratulations to Graham Paul (foil), Richard Bonehill (sabre) and Janet Cooksey (foil and epee), who won world championship titles. It is fantastic to have four veteran world champions, among them a double world champion in Janet Cooksey.

PARIS WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

The senior world championships were superbly staged by the French Federation at the Grand Palais in Paris. For the first time these championships had a large paying public and almost daily live television coverage. This shows that fencing can be media attractive, if well presented and in countries with a large fencing public. Unfortunately, our team was hit by the injury of Richard Kruse before the championships and the food poisoning of Ed Jefferies once out there. Despite these set backs, the men's foil team fenced well to come 8th. In the individual, Martina Emmanuel and Chrystal Nicoll made top 32 placings. Overall, the results

were more modest than we had hoped for and clearly the fencers, coaches and their support teams will be looking at this as we approach the Olympic qualifying period. Nick Payne refereed in the finals, Janet Huggins (SEMI) and Keith Smith (Refereeing) were there as FIE delegates and Peter Jacobs attended as a member of the FIE Executive. Clare Halsted was also there working on anti-doping matters for the FIE. Paris provided a useful opportunity for John Timms and Johnny Davis to see a world championships and to prepare for the senior European championships. Having negotiated the funding for these championships from UK Sport, I am really eager that they go well. Piers Martin was also in Paris for several days and played host to a potential sponsor. Libby Payne attended a "Women in Sport" conference organised by the European Confederation and I hope she will play a key part in this movement.

FIE-SELECTED REFEREES

I am pleased to announce that Nick Payne, Steve Glaister, Matt Haynes, David Sach and Murray Morrison have been selected by the FIE for Grand Prix/Senior World Cups next season. I know that our BFA Refereeing Committee is also allocating referees to all the Junior World Cups.

GB CADET AND JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

The GB Cadet and Junior championships were once again well run at the English Institute of Sport in Sheffield. My thanks to all those who volunteered to help and in particular to all the Junior fencers who came to referee the Cadet championships. It was fantastic to have all the Cadet finals being refereed by Juniors.

PRO SABRE/ WOMEN'S SABRE SPONSORSHIP

The Pro Sabre tournament was again well organised and the staging of the finals was exceptional. My thanks to Jon Salfield, Richard Bonehill and Maxine McCombie for all their hard work and to John Williams for his generous sponsorship of this event and the whole Truro programme. It

was good to see a high level competition with our best sabre referees in action, as well as invited foreign FIE refs. I was also pleased to be able to announce that a sponsor, who wishes to remain anonymous, has agreed to fund our women's sabre team for World Cups.

SPORTSAID BALL AND FUNDING

My thanks to Katie Dolan for organising fencing at the SportsAid Ball. We have had positive feedback from SportsAid and another event is being organised in January. In particular, the "have a go" sessions proved very popular. SportsAid give us over £40,000 per year in grants for younger fencers. We are grateful to them for their continued support. My thanks to Penny Spink, who so efficiently and successfully carries out all the administrative work to ensure that our younger fencers have access to these grants.

GB V JAPAN

The Lansdowne Club, who kindly sponsor our men's foil Pathway fencers, again hosted a Great Britain match, this time against Japan. This sort of event allows our team to fence top opposition and then train with the foreign team. My immense thanks to Rupert Davies-Cooke and Ziemek Wojciechowski for setting this all up. The Japanese team, including Beijing Olympic silver medallist Yuki Ota, won narrowly 45-41.

LANSDOWNE/BRITISH FENCING BALL

On Friday 15th April 2011, the Lansdowne Club, in conjunction with British Fencing, will be hosting a Fencing Ball. This is intended to be an excellent evening and we hope that as many fencers as possible will attend. Details will be announced by the Lansdowne Club as soon as possible.

BRITISH FENCING DINNER AND CELEBRATION 2012

I am glad to announce that we now have a group working on this project. We aim to hold a dinner with entertainment before the Olympics in

2012 on similar lines to the British Fencing centenary held in 2002. It is hoped that many people will attend. Once more details are known, these will be published in *The Sword* and on the BFA website. Malcolm Fare will be producing several publications to mark 2012 and also our 110th birthday.

ULU TEAM/ELITE SERIES EPEE

My congratulations to the University of London who successfully held their team competition at St. Paul's School. There were 44 teams and plate competitions were held. There was an excellent atmosphere, good fencing and over £200 was donated to Children in Need. This competition clearly feeds a need for team events. I also attended the Elite Series Epee competition held at City of London Freemans' school. Chris Howser did a superb job and the entry was of high quality. Fencers told me they wished more events were run like this.

PARENTS' GROUP MEETING

The first meeting of the Parents' Group was held in Birmingham and chaired by Sue McGeever. I attended as did several other BFA directors. Clare Halsted and Piers Martin were invited specifically to answer questions on behalf of the BFA. I think this was a useful meeting and a forum that should meet regularly. It can be a useful source of information for the BFA and also a means of aiding better communication.

2011

We will be hosting the Camden Cadet sabre, part of the European Cadet circuit, and also the FIE senior women's sabre World Cup and team World Cup in early 2011. I hope that sabre supporters will come to these events and cheer our fencers on as they compete on home territory. In July we host the Senior European championships in Sheffield. We really want large audiences each day. I hope you will want to come and see the very best fencers in Europe competing in the UK.

Senior World Championships

A personal view from photo-reporter Graham Morrison

The 110-year-old Grand Palais in Paris is, by any standards, a classy location for a fencing event. It owes its existence in part to the Germans; in 1892 Berlin announced an exhibition for the turn of the century. That was enough for the French to start work on their own event. As with year 2000, 1900 symbolised magic.

Banked seating bound the now usual four-strip-plus-central-final-piste layout on three sides with a giant plasma screen on the fourth, plus scoreboards. Behind the seating, one side was used for wheelchair fencing and the other for the direct elimination rounds.

Women's sabre was first off, and Mariel Zagunis could not put a foot wrong as she dominated the event. At the moment she seems in a class of her own. Most of her opponents stayed respectfully in single figures. But for gold her opponent, Olga Kharlan from the Ukraine, proved a trifle tougher and the fight went to 15-11. The last hit was pretty clear – a decent parry-riposte – but still it was challenged. The US has a real gem of a fencer in Zagunis, who has yet to peak and is likely to set records to challenge the established 'greats' of the sport.

Earlier in the day Chystall Nicoll got off to a flying start by winning all six of her bouts in the poule, but was still seeded no higher than 21. She then won her first DE fight against Vila (ESP), but went out to Kim (KOR) in the L32 by the narrowest of margins 14-15. Jo Hutchison also reached this round by making a tremendous start in her first DE in which she knocked out the No. 7 seed, Perrous (FRA), 15-13 after fighting back from 8-11. Then she was also edged out 14-15, in her case by Nagy (HUN).

The only other Brit to reach the L32 was Italian-born foilist Martina Emanuel, who chalked up a good victory over Zacke of Germany before going out to another German, Waechter, 12-15. Three Italians in the women's foil top four – what a surprise! If there is one thing I'm not too keen on it's an all-Italian women's foil final, and I hoped against hope that Hyung Hee Nam (KOR) would beat Elisa Di Francisca. The fight got off to a flying video appeal to give Nam the first hit. But by 6-5 I realised I was living with false hope; the Italian went through 15-12. The second semi between Valentina Vezzali and Arianna Errigo was slow, with Vezzali waking up late in the day; she appealed three times for the video, but each time the referee was right and she had to settle for bronze. The final was slow but could have been worse and ended 15-11 to Di Francisca.

The men's sabre final looked like being a near-perfect whitewash with the Korean Young Woo Won reaching 12-1 before Nicolas Limbach of Germany woke up. Even if he did top the 2009/10 world rankings and was defending his title, the German was never going to deal with a deficit of such proportions. He tried hard though and managed to claw back another eight points before going down 9-15. When scores like 12-1 come up at this level, you start to wonder how on earth the other fencer got to the final in the first place. Surely all his opponents weren't just rubbish? Maybe he really was asleep at the wheel, but out-classed he certainly was and Won won wonderfully.

By mid-afternoon on the first epee day the Grand Palais had become 'Flessel-town', as the noisiest supporters so far tried in vain to help their champion through the quarter-finals; she just went down 14-15 to the No. 1 seed, Emese Szasz of Hungary. Laura Flessel's team-mate Maureen Nisima edged out the Russian third seed Tatiana Logounova 15-14 in the semis and then defeated Szasz 15-10 for the title.

I had to return to London and missed the men's foil and epee. In men's foil, Britain's representatives all went out in the L64: Laurence Halsted to Hatoel (ISR), Jamie Kenber to Meinhardt (USA), Ed Jefferies to Le Pechoux (FRA) and Rhys Melia to Ota (JPN). Of these tough opponents, all but one reached the quarter-finals, where Ota and Meinhardt went on to win the bronze medals. The final saw Germany's Peter Joppich collect his fourth title with a 15-11 victory over Lei Sheng of China, who added a silver to his previous two bronze medals.

The final stages of men's epee saw Frenchmen Grumier and Lucenay contest one semi-final, with Grumier coming out on top, while outsider Novosjolov of Estonia beat Boczko (HUN) in the other and went on to a comfortable 15-8 victory in the final.

I got back to Paris just in time to miss the Italy-China men's foil team final, which apparently proved highly entertaining when the Chinese coach/team rushed onto the piste before the referee had awarded the final hit against the Italians. Yellow card! But much to Italian consternation, a yellow to the coach does not annul a hit. However, the ensuing affray did provide 30 minutes of distraction to annoy the television commentators.

The gold medal men's epee match on the last day turned out to be one of world fencing's defining encounters – USA versus France, new against old. What a fright the French must have had, seeing the Americans leading for nearly two-thirds of the match. And what a thrilling fight-back, as the French got a grip and took charge to win 45-36, collecting their seventh successive world/Olympic men's epee team gold. These championships demonstrated that the USA and the eastern countries are about deliver on their promise to turn the existing order on its head. All told, a pretty good championships. ■

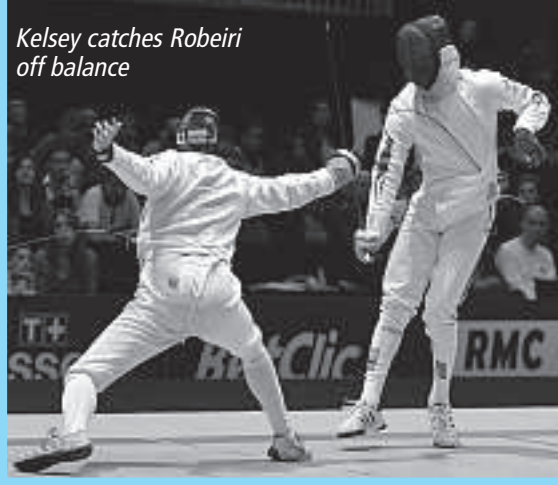

Fencers in motion

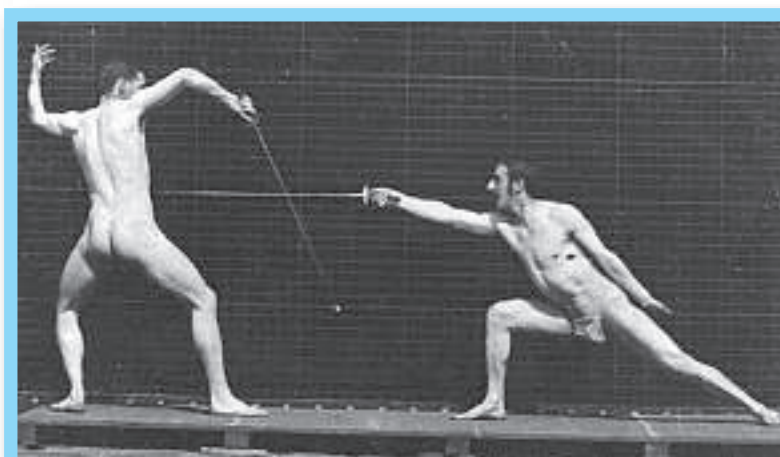


Fig. 1: Study of fencers, 1882 [Eadweard Muybridge]

Motion sequence photography was invented by Eadweard Muybridge, who was born in England but became famous in America, where he developed a method of projecting still images taken in rapid succession to recreate movement. In the 1870s, his images of galloping horses, using a wire to trigger the shutters of up to 24 cameras in a row, earned him world-wide fame. Continuing his experiments, he photographed thousands of people, often naked including himself, and, in 1882, a pair of fencers (Fig. 1), to show precisely how the body moved. Together, these images formed the first database of human and animal locomotion, used by both scientists and artists to help them depict motion accurately.

Inspired by Muybridge's work, the French physiologist Etienne-Jules

Marey also used photography to analyse movement. Marey and his assistant Georges Demeny developed a new type of camera that could capture the individual phases of a

subject moving through time and space on a single plate: chronophotographic images. The extent to which the figures were separated or overlapped depended on the frequency with which the plate was exposed by the rotation of a slotted-disc shutter. In 1906 Demeny, who had become Professor of Physiology at the Joinville School of Gymnastics and Fencing, produced a silver gelatin print of a fencer in motion (Fig. 2).

In the 1930s, Marey's scientific legacy was continued by Harold Edgerton, an electrical engineer at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Edgerton took photographs using a high-speed electronic flash to produce a stroboscopic effect. With flashes up to a million times a second, Edgerton took images of fencers, pole vaulters and divers in the style of Marey but with far greater accuracy and clarity (Fig. 3).

Fencing soon became a favourite subject of multiple image photography, as shown by photographers such as Gjon Mili in his 1942 exposures of American collegiate champion Arthur Tauber in action at epee and sabre (Figs. 4 & 5), Irving Haberman with 1948 American women's foil champion Helena Dow (Fig. 6) and Ronald Startup, who took four exposures per second of Britain's former world foil champion Allan Jay lunging in 1968 (Fig. 7).

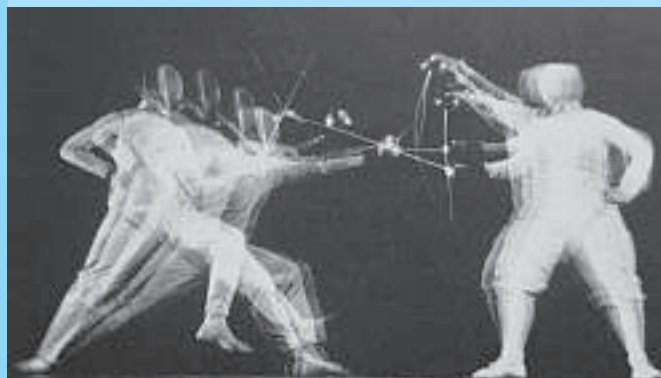


Fig. 8: Grigorescu (ROM) and Funkenhauser (GER), 1993 [Karina Hoskyns]

Later in the 20th century it became fashionable to depict motion by deliberately blurring the image using long exposure times to give the impression that an object is moving so fast that our eyes can't focus on it, as in Karina Hoskyns's dramatic image from the 1993 world championships (Fig. 8).

Modern cinematography is still influenced by Muybridge's original work. The famous lobby scene in *The Matrix*, considered by many to be one of the greatest action scenes in film history, used a technique known as time-slice photography in which a large number of cameras are placed around an object and triggered nearly simultaneously.

Eden Cup and Leon Paul Cup

A record entry for the men's foil Eden Cup and Leon Paul Cup also saw some of the best home results for some years; in the Eden Cup James Davis, Jamie Fitzgerald and Kristjan Archer came 5th, 6th and 8th respectively, while the Leon Paul International saw Davis taking silver and Keith Cook a bronze. Altogether, 134 fencers from 27 countries arrived at the Redbridge Leisure Centre for the junior A-grade, including 24 out of the world top 32, while the Leon Paul Cup entry was 119.

Home star of the weekend was James Davis, a finalist in both events. In the Eden Cup, five poule victories gave him a good 6th seeding for the direct elimination and a first round bye. A close encounter 15-14 in the L64 against Belgium's Hans Lecocq was followed by the unpleasant task of eliminating Husayn Rosowsky 15-9. One further victory came Davis's way, a good 15-12 against the USA's Alexander Massialas, before he was dispatched by another American, Race Imboden, 15-5. Apart from a close call in the L16, when he only just overcame Italy's Michele Di Francisca, Imboden was not taken into double figures all day, going on to win gold by beating Russia's Evgeniy Filippov 15-9 in the final.

It was Filippov who ended Jamie Fitzgerald's run, stopping him 15-10 in the quarter-finals. Until then, apart from his L64 fight against the American Nobuo Bravo which stretched him to 15-14, Fitzgerald had enjoyed a good day; he started with a bye and then dispatched his other two opponents in single figures. Archer fell 6-15 to the Czech Alexander Choupenitch in the last eight after narrowly defeating the 2009 winner David Willette of the USA 15-14.

The Leon Paul Cup on the following day, an FIE satellite competition, saw Davis retain his form for a silver medal – a really good result in a strong field. In the final, Davis trailed badly in the early stages, but came back strongly to go down 10-15 to the Dutchman Sebastian Borst. British champion Keith Cook, together with Marcus Mepstead, James Beevers and Peter Holder, accompanied Davis to the quarter-finals. Four of these five found themselves in the bottom half of the tableau, which was unfortunate as it pitted them against each other, but good in that it guaranteed one home place in the gold medal fight. In fact, the grouping extended further down the order; in the L16 Davis beat Fitzgerald 15-13, while Mepstead beat Husayan Rosowsky 15-11. Davis and Cook arrived in the semi-finals, seeing off Mepstead and Beevers 15-11 and 15-9 respectively. In the other half of the draw, Holder had a good run, knocking out 4th seed Ahmed Rosowsky 15-5 and then the Russian Ilya Burnatsev 15-10 before falling to Dan Elsner (GER) 4-15.

The Davis-Cook semi-final was evenly matched, with hardly two hits in it all the way. Either could have taken the fight, but Davis did just enough to make the final; his silver medal concluded an impressive home effort. ■

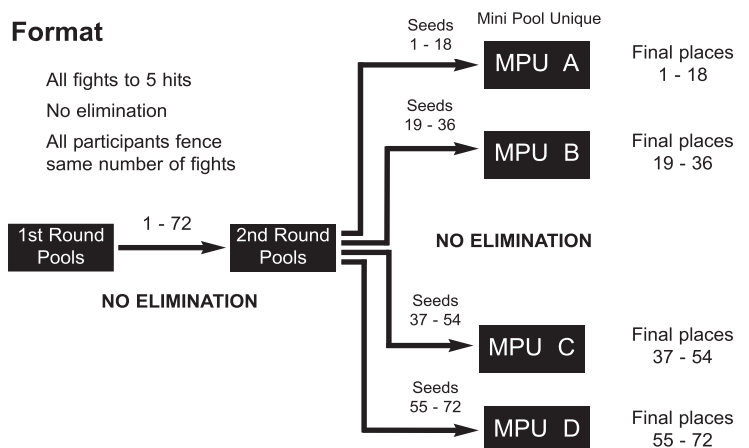

Bristol Fencing Academy – Filton College

The first fencers have arrived at Filton College, Bristol, and joined the British Fencing Academy. By studying at Filton for their Sixth Form option, they are connecting with probably the UK's finest fencing training facility for teenagers, while not compromising their university options. Indeed one of the team this year is aiming at straight grade As and a place in medical school, while others aim to be physiotherapists, teachers and sports scientists.

Four of the six-strong team are staying with local families, as they come from all over the country. These families are specially selected, have

their own children and are well known to Filton College. The fencers' hosts form one in a group of caring mentors who look after these athletes as they work through their three A levels and their fencing at the college.

The fencing fits into their working week and is smoothly moulded around their academic timetables. Five of this year's fencers are lucky enough to be Advanced Apprentices in Sporting Excellence (AASE) students. This gives them extra curriculum time for training and should lead to academic acknowledgement for their fencing training and performance. AASE students get up to 14 hours of fencing

training a week, in addition to other training, like strength and conditioning (three sessions a week), psychology, training theory, record keeping, lifestyle and nutrition.

Fencing Academy students train three days a week on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays in the afternoon. We are now recruiting for the September 2011 intake and there are only 17 places available. Carl Borack's Swashbuckling Career

"**E**rrol Flynn is alive and well and hoping to compete in Munich", said Gillian Reynolds in the *Sunday Times* in 1972. She was talking about American fencer Carl Borack, who was beginning to make his mark on the world stage. At the time, the *Sunday Times* was one of the most influential heavyweight papers in Britain and required reading for serious sport, but had not featured a fencer before, so the piece was a coup for both Borack and fencing.

He was building a career as a film producer in Hollywood, where he lived, and financing his travels on the international fencing circuit, something that, without sponsorship, was

as difficult then as it is impossible today. Not satisfied with just one weapon, he was managing final placings in all three. In 1969, at the age of 22, he became the youngest ever US national foil champion.

Borack was well known internationally, and especially by GB fencers; in 1966 as the lone US fencer in Vienna at the junior world championships he had to share rooms with Steve Boston and Bob Anderson. Charles de Beaumont could not understand how such a rich country as the USA left the 19-year-old to wander the international fencing circuit alone. It was only after witnessing his three-weapon successes, including qualifying for the Pan-Am

team and the Montreal world championships, that the US Federation realised the value of the junior world championships and fielded full teams, starting with London in 1968.

After the 1972 Olympics Carl Borack retired from serious competition, but continued fencing "just for fun". Well almost ... Warner Bros grabbed him to teach Ryan O'Neal to fence for Stanley Kubrick's *The Memory of Barry Lyndon*, a film for which Bob Anderson choreographed the fight scenes. With the formation of his own production company, Carl Borack Productions, numerous commissions came along and in 1977, with a childhood friend, the actor Richard Dreyfuss, he produced his first feature film, *The Big Fix*.

But fencing was not finished with Borack, and his professional film career dovetailed with sport as he was called up for the US Olympic Committee's publicity committee and as executive vice-president of the US Fencing Federation. He served 12 years on the FIE Publicity & Promotions Commission, four years as president. In one capacity or another Borack has attended every Olympics since 1972 except Moscow. "I was there once as an athlete, four times as team captain, once for the ABC TV network and three times as a spectator. I love the Olympic Games", he says.

1985 saw a special event, the QE2 Grand Masters Fencing Tournament, on the QE2 from Southampton to New York, organised by Borack. A fun event between teams of women foilists and men epeeists from GB, the USA and

Germany, fencers had to be over 30 (women) and over 35 (men), who had represented their country at world championships. A master, Michael D'Asaro, was engaged and gave lessons to Cunard passengers. Apart for a lot of fun, a lot of publicity followed; even the Wall Street Journal took it.

Borack's love of fencing is matched by his passion for making films, especially family films. His *Shiloh* trilogy, based on the award-winning books of Phyllis Reynolds Naylor, were critically acclaimed. He has also turned another book by the same author into a film – *Alice Upside Down*.

Now a new book has captured his imagination, *The Devil's Sword* by Douglas E Richards (see his review on p.22). Documentaries are on his wish list too. "We are a unique sport and many very successful people have emanated from the competitive environment to the real world in a major way", he says and mentions Pal Schmitt, twice Olympic epee team champion and now President of Hungary, Jean-Francois Lamour, double Olympic sabre champion and former French Minister of Sport, Australian Olympian and former President of the World Bank James Wolfenson and Thomas Bach the German foil team gold medallist and IOC vice-president. In fact the list is long on examples of success in the world of work coupled with success in fencing. He would like to examine that relationship but, as he says, "Like every one of my film projects, I just have to figure out how to get them funded". ■

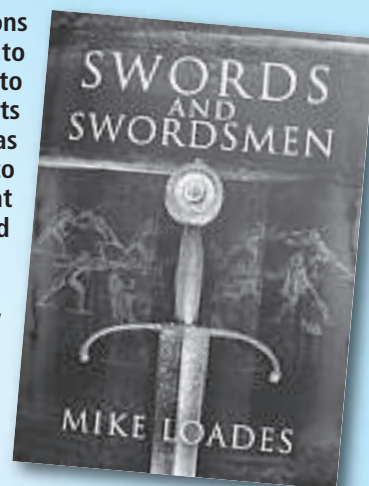
SWORDS AND SWORDSMEN

In *Swords and Swordsmen* fight arranger and historical weapons expert Mike Loades takes the history of the sword and links it to historical figures, tracking this iconic weapon from Ancient Egypt to the American Civil War and presenting each sword in the context of its time. His enthusiasm for the subject comes through on every page as he discusses all aspects of the sword from methods of manufacture to use as objects of fashion. In addition, he outlines the development and character of different fighting styles and tells tales of the sword both in battle and private duel.

Among the swords considered in detail are those of Tutankhamun, Alexander the Great, King Raedwald, Henry V, Emperor Maximilian, legendary samurai Uesugi Kenshin, Henri IV of France, Oliver Cromwell, George Washington, Lt. Henry Lane (a Hussar at the Battle of Waterloo) and Generals Stuart and Custer. Each sword becomes a prism through which to see a little of the life of the man who once held it.

Chapters are devoted to the rapier and smallsword, in which the author explains how fencing technique evolved to meet the requirements of gentlemen who wished to add the elegant art of fence to their accomplishments. By the time Angelo was appointed fencing master to the future George III in 1760, fencing with foils had become a genteel recreation, far removed from the bloody and dangerous swordplay of earlier times.

For modern fencers, *Swords and Swordsmen* vividly brings to life the weapons from which our sport derives as Mike Loades shares his passion and fascination for the sword and takes the reader on a journey through history. Meticulously researched and beautifully illustrated by over 200 photographs and 100 line drawings, this book is well worth its comparatively high price of £40. It is published by Pen & Sword Books. ■



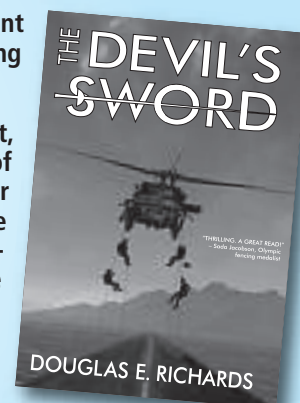

Obituary

DOROTHY KNOWLES (1906-2010)

Dr Dorothy Knowles, who has died at the age of 104, was an indomitable fighter on the piste who loved sharing her experiences in the arenas of sport, linguistics, music and drama. My first memory of her was of seeing a grey-haired woman coming at me from the other end of the piste, wielding her foil in wide circular strokes at the Kursal in Southend. It was my first open competition and I was a little terrified.

Over the years I came to know her well and have fond memories of being entertained at her home with her husband Jack – Professor John Stephenson Spink. They loved to celebrate New Year with friends and would commence with early afternoon tea on New Year's Eve and continue in a leisurely way till late next day. The two of them travelled widely in Europe and the Middle East and made an adventurous road trip across Russia just after the war when there were few petrol stations to be found.

Born in Johannesburg where her Yorkshire-born father was a mining engineer, Dorothy Knowles – later known by her married name of Diana Spink – came to England at the age of six and gained a BA degree in French at Leeds University in 1928. She continued her studies at the Sorbonne where she completed her Doctorate. A post at Liverpool University followed in 1934 and she lectured in the French Department there until 1967, becoming a distinguished scholar in contemporary French theatre with several publications to her name.

Dorothy began to make an impact on the fencing world in 1936, when she started the Liverpool University Fencing Club and immediately organised an open foil tournament, only the second provincial fencing competition in the country. This was an event she was to win many times. In 1948, she also won the Leamington Easter tournament, the most important competition to be held outside London. The following year she was elected first chair of the Amateur Fencing Association's Northern Section, which won the first Winton Cup in 1950.

After moving to London in 1953, Dorothy became a prominent member of the London Fencing Club, winning the women's team championship with Gillian Sheen, Mary Glen Haig and Margaret Durne for six years in succession. In 1957 she came 7th out of 32 in her first electric foil tournament – the international De Beaumont Cup – and the following year returned to Liverpool to win the Aylward Sword of Honour mixed event from a field of 41.

In the Spring 1965 issue of *The Sword*, she reported on a visit to Moscow's Dynamo Fencing Club, where she fenced a succession of eager opponents until excused to go to the Bolshoi ballet. As a child she had been a talented ballet dancer who performed on stage with Marie Lloyd and Lupino Lane. During her years in Liverpool she gave solo dance shows in the Philharmonic Hall. She was also a gifted actress and theatrical director whose plays were performed at the Arts Theatre.

In 1966, at the age of 60, Dorothy Knowles once again reached the final of the Liverpool tournament and two years later she was still accumulating enough points from the three senior British competitions to be ranked among the top 20 British women foilists.

In her eighties she continued to go to the Polytechnic in Regent Street, braving the tube from her home in North Finchley with her weapons on her back. Her fighting spirit was displayed on many occasions, not least in dealing with burglars when she once (she was burgled three times) grabbed a poker and chased the thief down the road.

At this time she also assisted with rehearsals of the revolutionary productions of the left-wing French playwright Armand Gatti, having written a major assessment of his work. She was working on the translation of one of Gatti's plays until shortly before her death. An inspiring teacher and a woman of extraordinary energy and brilliance, she filled every moment with interesting activities. ■

Round-Up

COMMONWEALTH CHAMPIONSHIPS

For the first time the Commonwealth championships in Australia combined senior and veterans' events, causing a clash with the veterans' world championships in Croatia and splitting the entry to both. Only one person qualified for a senior team and as a veteran – the remarkable Richard Cohen, who at 63 qualified for Northern Ireland and thus became the oldest fencer at a senior Commonwealth championship. And he was not blown away by the youngsters either, winning four out of six bouts in his poule and finishing a respectable 12th overall out of 38. The next day he added Commonwealth gold to his many veteran world and European titles, just edging out the relatively young Australian Alex Telegin 10-9 in the final.

Britain won 16 medals in the senior Commonwealth, but only five in the veterans' events. Senior men's foil saw Tom Hendrie (ENG) come second to the Australian Frank Bartolillo, with Daniel Robinson (ENG) and David Alexander (NIR) equal third. Also runner-up in her women's foil event (to Yuan of New Zealand) was Lisa McKenzie (SCO), with Claire Bennett (ENG) collecting bronze.

Epeeist Marc Burkhalter (WAL) won gold with a convincing 15-10 victory over Lim (SIN), two Englishmen, James Thornton and Dudley Tredger, coming equal third. With a

bronze to her credit, Jayne Crook (ENG) picked up Britain's sole medal in women's epee.

Sabre was dominated by England, Anthony Crutchett narrowly beating Maiyuran Ratneswaran 15-14 in the men's final, while Jo Hutchison had a slightly easier 15-10 victory over Sophie Williams in the women's event. Keith Bowers (SCO), Jessica Davies (WAL) and Katie Hendra all collected bronze medals.

With most leading British vets choosing Croatia over the long haul to Melbourne, Australia dominated the veterans' Commonwealth championships, winning all the gold medals except men's sabre. Only four English bronze medals could be added to Cohen's gold: Michael Thomas in men's foil, Angela Findlay in women's epee and sabreurs Keith Rogers and Vanessa Hendra.

Henry de Silva (IOM) won the 70+ category in men's foil and epee and also received a gold medal for services to Commonwealth veterans fencing.

VETERANS' WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Britain brought back four gold medals and five bronzes from the veterans' world championships in Porec, Croatia. Dominating her 70+ age group, Janet Cooksey won the foil and epee events and lost by one hit to the eventual winner in the sabre to finish equal third. Her goal next year is to win all three weapons.

After a faltering start in his poule, during which he dropped two bouts, Graham Paul won his first two 60+ men's foil DE fights without difficulty, but was taken to 6-5 by last year's silver medallist, Ide of Japan, in the quarter-finals. He then beat team-mate Steve Fox 10-5 in the semis and had an answer to everything Kawaguchi of Japan tried against him in the final, winning 10-3 to add another gold medal to his collection.

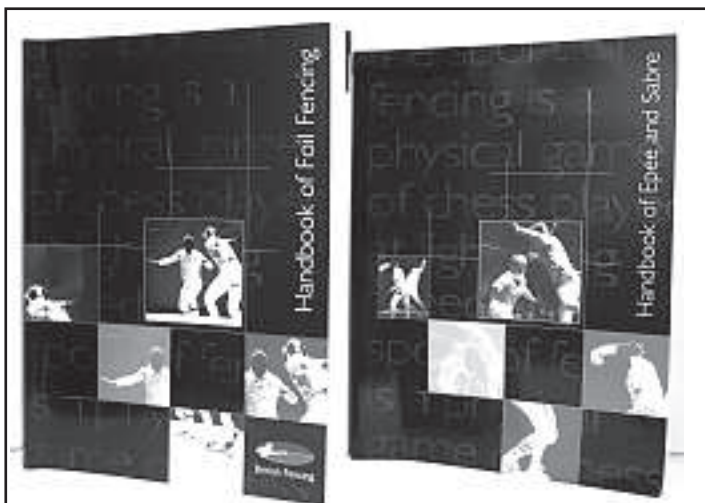
Britain's fourth gold medal went to a rampant Richard Bonehill, who after a tough first DE in the 60+ men's sabre against Herbst (GER), which he just won 10-9, became more confident as time went by, taking out Panon (FRA) 10-6 in the quarter-finals, Carmina (ITA) 10-8 in the semis and was unstoppable in the final, demolishing Ray Sexton III 10-3.

Clare Halsted went from strength to strength in the 60+ women's foil, reaching the semi-finals with a 6-2 victory over Gorius (GER) and was leading former senior world champion Demaille (FRA) until the last few seconds when the Frenchwoman equalised and then snatched the last hit.

Kate Elvin also went out by one hit to Demaille, this time in the 60+ women's epee, but collected a bronze medal. Another bronze went to Jane Hutchison in the 50+ women's sabre after a hard battle in the semi-finals with Janshen (GER).

Over 500 students braved the freezing conditions at the end of November to compete in the British Universities and Colleges Sport (BUCS) fencing championships. The event has grown over the last few years and in order to accommodate more competitors the event moved to Oxstalls Tennis Centre in Gloucester which also hosts the British Veterans Championships.

The women's sabre on the first day proved to be one of the highlights of the tournament, as a repeat of last year's final saw defending champion Katie Hendra (Brunel) take on Kira Roberts (Durham). A pulsating final saw Roberts avenge her defeat 15-12 to win gold after a thrilling day's competition. For the fifth successive year Hannah Bryars from Imperial won the women's foil, taking the title by beating Elizabeth Ng from Surrey in the final.

BRITISH JUNIOR/CADET CHAMPIONSHIPS

Men's Foil

Husayan Rosowsky, formerly of Salle Kiss and now fencing at Sussex House, has made spectacular progress through the Junior ranks. Three years ago he was a bronze medallist, last year silver medallist and now champion. He had a tough fight against Alex Tofalides of Salle Paul in the semi-finals, only just emerging victorious 15-14, but then cruised to a comfortable 15-6 win in the final over Amol Rattan of Newham, whose two previous bouts had been draining as he edged victories over James Davis (Paul) 15-14 in the semis and Oscar Arron (Clifton College) 14-13 in the L8.

In the Cadet championship, Kristjan Archer of Cambridge, now ranked 7th in Europe, overcame Alex Savin (Newham) 15-10 in the final after both had had similar victories in the semi-finals over Thomas Corlett (Kiss) and Alex Lloyd (Sussex House) respectively. Lloyd, at only 14, put down a marker at these championships by also reaching the L16 in the Junior event. Another even younger competitor who showed his mettle was 13-year-old John Feaster of Malvern, who defeated No. 1 seed Callum De Sainte Croix (Wallace) in the Cadet championship to reach the L16.

Women's Foil

Several cadets stormed through to final placings in the Junior championship as well as the Cadet event. Amy Lineham of Salle Paul started with a bronze medal in the Cadet and followed up by winning the Junior. Leah King (Fighting Fit) and Ayesha Fihosy (Boston), respectively gold and silver Cadet medallists, each reached the L8 of the Junior. And Alex Craig (Laszlo) picked up a bronze in the Cadet and Junior, with Chiara McDermott (Crawley) also reaching the L8 in both events.

Both 16-year-old King and 14-year-old Fihosy raced through the Cadet DE as first and second seeds respectively to reach the final without being taken into double figures. Although two years younger than her opponent, Fihosy fought hard before King took control to win 15-11 and collect her second successive Cadet title. In the Junior, Lineham only just overcame Natasha Thomson (West Fife) 14-13 in the semi-finals and then held off Grace Stafford (Aldershot) 11-5 to win the championship.

Men's Epee

Philip Marsh of Bath captured both Cadet and Junior titles in fine style. He swept through the Cadet event without being taken into double figures, beating Jack Hudson of Aberdeen 15-9 in the final. The Junior proved rather harder, with a narrow 15-14 win over Steve Pinkerton of Truro in the semi-finals and another close call in the final, where he beat the reigning champion Jonathan May 15-13. Hudson also had a good weekend, adding a bronze medal in the Junior to his Cadet silver, reversing the colours he won the previous year.

Women's Epee

Amy Radford of Malvern also pulled off the double, never really being threatened in the Cadet event where she beat Nina Moiseiwitsch of Aldershot 15-11 in the final to regain her title. She now has the impressive record of twice winning this championship and twice being runner-up in the past four years. The Junior was a different matter and Radford had to fight hard to beat Abigail Harvey (Rose) 15-14 in the L16 and was again taken to the last hit in the final against Rebecca Thomas (Tiger), before winning her first Junior title. She had earlier beaten Caitlin Chang of Harrogate 15-11 in one semi-final, while Thomas defeated Leonora Mackinnon of Malvern 15-13 in the other.

Men's Sabre

The Artesi brothers of Camden had a good weekend, Fabio winning the Cadet championship, with Gian-Franco picking up bronze medals in both Cadet and Junior events. The top four cadets were all north Londoners, Fabio beating Nick Williams of the North London Sabre Club 15-11 in one semi, while Gian-Franco went down to club-mate Rubin Ansaalem 9-15 in the other. Fabio Artesi won the final 15-10.

In the Junior the first and second seeds, Curtis Miller of Camden and James Honeybone of Truro, duly proceeded to the final where they had the closest fight of the day. After a hard battle, Honeybone won 15-14 to collect his second title and consign Miller to the runner-up slot for the second year running. In the semi-finals Honeybone beat Gian-Franco Artesi 15-6 and Miller defeated Harry Boteler (Xiphoi) 15-12.

Women's Sabre

The third double of the weekend went to Aliya Itzkowitz of Camden, who defeated Alice Maidwell-Smith of Truro for the Cadet title. Both semi-finals had been tight, Itzkowitz beating Victoria Carson (North London) 15-14 in one, while Maidwell-Smith eliminated Georgia Yates (City) 15-13 in the other. But in the final Itzkowitz was in full control, winning 15-7.

Carson had another good run in the Junior, knocking out the No. 1 seed Verity Ridgeon of Scimitar 15-11 in her second DE fight and continuing on to the final. Itzkowitz had a tough fight in the quarters, only just overcoming Emily Ruaux of Rivington Park 15-14 and then Laura Hunter-Thomas 15-13 to reach the final where she won decisively 15-9.

EUROPEAN JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

Husayan Rosowsky wins bronze

Britain's men foilists won two bronze medals at the European Junior Championships in Lobnya, Russia. Following his bronze in the 2008 cadet world championships, Husayan Rosowsky put in another impressive performance, with victories over Betz (GER) 15-12, fifth seed Trani (ITA) 15-5 and team-mate Jamie Fitzgerald 13-12 to reach the semi-finals. Here he met Mauritz Kroepflin of Germany, who was in devastating form, brushing everyone aside in the DE to win the title without once being taken into double figures. Rosowsky lost 6-15 to finish equal third.

Fitzgerald and Alex Tofalides also had good runs. Fourth seed after the poules, Fitzgerald had a bye to the L32 and then beat Ulman (ISR) 15-7 and Safin (RUS) 15-9 before just losing to finish fifth. Tofalides beat Piotr Janda (POL) 15-5, Nissim (GRE) 15-9 and Di Francisca (ITA) 15-6, before losing a slow-scoring quarter-final against Wlosek (POL) 2-3 to finish seventh.

Although James Davis had a bad day, going straight out in the L64, he made up for it in the team event. Our combined individual results made Britain No. 1 seeds, with a bye into the L8 against the Czech Republic. Rosowsky won the opening fight 5-2, but then Fitzgerald went down 2-7 to Choupenitch, their best fencer. In the third fight Tofalides stormed to an 8-3 victory to give GB back the lead at 15-12. From that point, the match was under control with the final score 45-27 as Davis won the last fight against Choupenitch 5-4. But in the semi-finals against a rampant Italy determined to make up for their poor performance in the individual event GB collapsed 27-45.

And so to the bronze medal match against Russia. Coach Maciej Wojtkowiak said team tactics were to keep the score low and wait for the Russians to make mistakes. After four bouts the two teams were level at 11-all. Then Tofalides lost concentration against Safin and Russia pulled ahead to lead 20-16. Wojtkowiak brought in Davis for the penultimate bout and he levelled the match again at 25-all. In the last fight Fitzgerald with his calm style and reliable technique faced the fast and powerful Safin. But things did not start well as a nervous Fitzgerald made little impression on Safin's strong defence and the Russian built up a 30-26 lead. Then, with 1 minute to go, Fitzgerald changed tactics to second-intention moves and managed to level the score as time expired. Wojtkowiak explained what happened in extra time, "Jamie launched his favourite action in which distance and timing are crucial: a deliberately short attack forced his opponent to adjust the distance in order to riposte, opening a small window that allowed Jamie to remise while closing the line – one light." GB had won the bronze medal.

The only other British fencer to reach the final tableau was epeeist Amy Radford, who has to count herself lucky after a dreadful start in her poule, where she collected just one 3-2 victory to scrape into the DE as the last qualifier. But then she settled down, beating Komerov (ISR), Sziklavari (HUN) and former Cadet European champion Beljajeva (EST) 15-12 to reach the quarter-finals where she fell to Guchmazova (RUS) to finish eighth.

Sabreurs Curtis Miller and Sophie Williams both reached the L16. Miller had an excellent 15-11 win over the second seed Kostenko (RUS) before losing to the eventual silver medallist Scepi (ITA) 9-15. Williams beat Gardos (HUN) 15-9 and then just lost to the No. 1 seed Marton (HUN) 14-15.

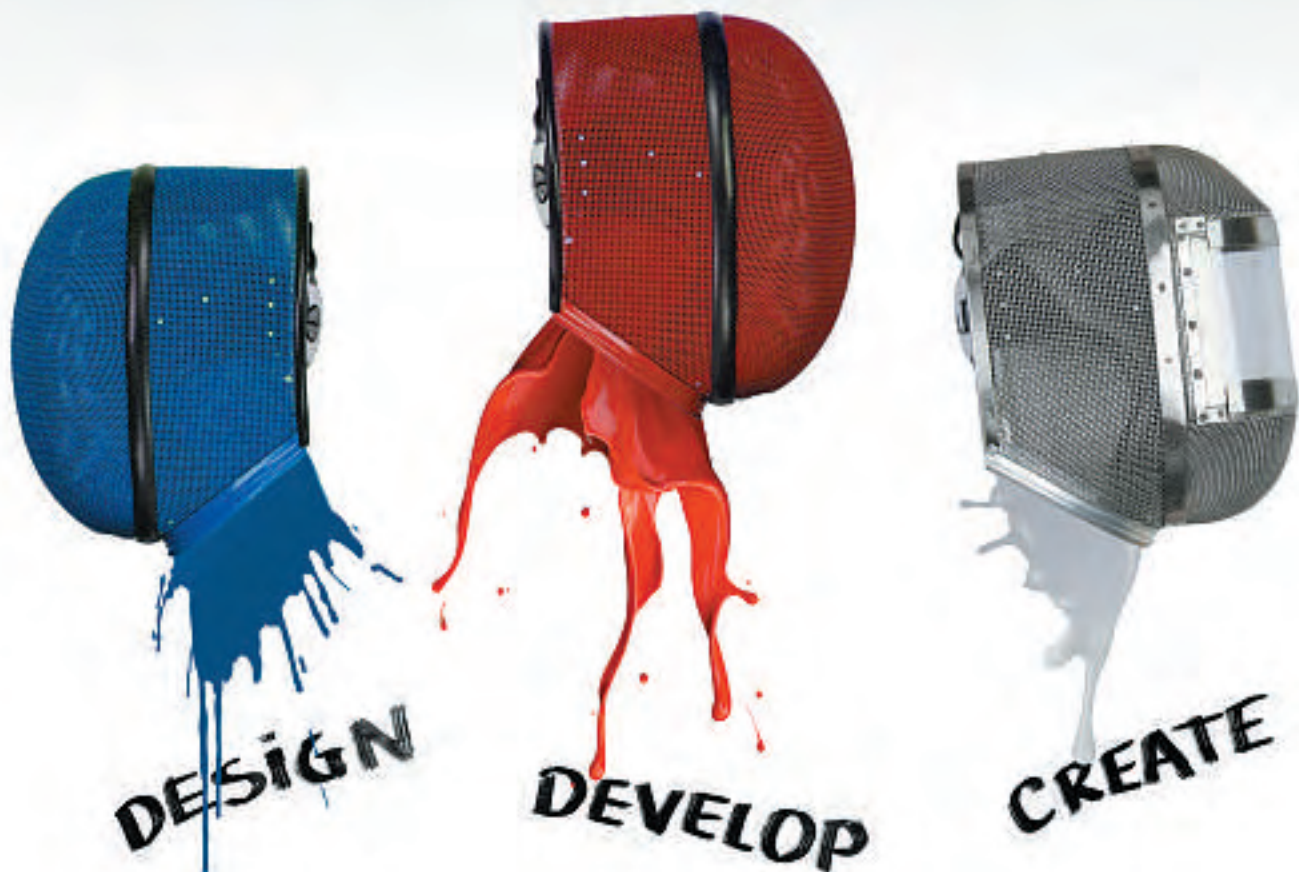
